



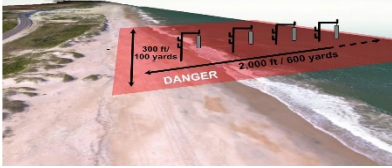

USGS placing instruments on Pea Island to study wave heights, water levels during storms



Scientists from the U.S. Geological Survey have begun deploying scientific instruments in Pea Island National Wildlife Refuge to continuously measure wave heights, water levels, and currents to study nearshore coastal processes during coastal storms. These installations are extremely hazardous and the public is advised not to swim, surf, fish or boat near them or between the signage on the beach and to be cautious of currents that may cause anyone to drift into the hazardous area. This study is a collaboration between the USGS, U.S. Army Corps of Engineers, Woods Hole Oceanographic Institution, U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service, U.S. Coastal Research Program, as well as North Carolina State University, and University of North Carolina Wilmington and Chapel Hill. The cooperators have worked together to inform the U.S. Coast Guard, local marinas, surf shops and other business in the local area about the equipment installations. They've also distributed flyers to visitor centers and they will be posting warning signs at the study site to inform beachgoers of the danger of the equipment in the water and nearby area. This instrument deployment will involve installing more than a dozen metal pipes from the dunes into the surf zone. The 3-inch diameter poles are 15 feet long, with about 5 feet extending out of...
